Purpose	<p>This Schedule will support the implementation of the Australian Fire Danger Rating System. The new Australian Fire Danger Rating System will improve public safety and reduce the impacts of bushfires by improving decision making enabled by more accurate scientific information. Nationally consistent fire danger rating information will be available to the public, reducing confusion about how to react to a warning.</p> <p>The funding NSW receives through this agreement (on behalf of all states and territories) will assist in addressing recommendation 13.1 of the Royal Commission into National Natural Disaster Arrangements.</p>
