Purpose	This Schedule will support participating states to deliver transport assistance grants to forestry entities to be used for transporting bushfire-salvaged construction grade softwood logs salvaged from the 2019-20 Black Summer bushfires to timber mills with capacity to manufacture structural timbers for the domestic building industry. The relevant program is the Construction Softwood Transport Assistance Program.

This arrangement shall be progressed through letters signed by the relevant state government ministers and the relevant Commonwealth Government Minister. The transfer of funds will be final, and no additional transfers of funds will be permissible. These funds may only be used under the program and will otherwise be forfeited. |
